"She Like Electric"

Seattle's 11 and 13-year-old sister act Smoosh have decided to spend their summer break this year opening for The Eels on an extended North American tour.

This is not that shocking for anyone familiar with these underage road veterans who have already opened for Pearl Jam, Death Cab for Cutie, The Presidents of the USA, Cat Power, Sleater-Kinney, Jimmy Eat World and Mates of State. They also just recently returned from a month spent opening for The Go! Team in the U.K.

As anyone who has heard their album knows, these self-directed musical prodigies can hold their own against any fully grown bands. *She Like Electric* was named number 8 in DIW (Devil in the Woods) magazine's top 10 albums of the year. ROCKRGL magazine compared their sound to "a stripped down version of the first side of Pet Sounds." The band also garnered a 5-star review in Alternative Press and scored 10 of 10 in Vice Magazine.

The band has also been featured on the BBC, and on NPR and was the subject of a feature story on The Today Show. Their video has also been in rotation on MTV2.
